The given course assumes the adapted training of foreign undergraduate students, post-graduate students and young researchers through realization of two parts of the program: theoretical and practical.

The courses offered within the framework of summer school are designed for archaeologists, historians, ethnographers, philologists (studying German dialects), sociologists and journalists.

Three courses on history of Siberia will be read during the theoretical part of the course according to the given below thematic plans constructed on the traditional cultural-chronological paradigm.

The practical part of the course includes a series of fact-finding excursions on museums, libraries, archives of Barnaul and archaeological monuments of Altai Region and the Republic of Altai and participation in field excavations and ethnographic researches on one or two archaeological objects of different types.

All planned measures will be fulfilled within the framework of summer school "History of Siberia" organized by Altai State University.

Course 1, 10 h. (in German) History of Siberia at the Antiquity and in the Middle Ages

1. History of study of the Siberian Palaeolithic – 1h.
2. Mesolithic and Neolithic of Siberia. Neolithic cultures of the Baikal Sea region – 1 h.
3. The Eneolithic and Early Bronze Ages. Palaeometal's archaeological cultures of Southern and Western Siberia – 2 h.
4. The Middle and Late Bronze Ages. Andronov's cultural-historical unification and andronoidal cultures of Siberia – 1 h.
5. The Scythian epoch. Arzhan-maemir local culture and Scythian-Siberian cultures (Pazyryk, Tagar, Saglyn) – 2 h.
6. Primitive art of Siberia. The Scythian-Siberian animal style -1 h.
7. The Hunnic-Sarmatical epoch – 1 h.
8. Ethno-cultural history of Altai in epoch of the Early and Classical Middle Ages – 1 h.

German national district of Altai Region.

Places of compact residing of Russian Germans on the territory of Altai Region (districts of Rubtsovsk, Tabun, Kulunda, Blagoveshenka). **The special conditions for performance of the educational plan: availability of a complex of inoculations (including against encephalitis); medical insurance; availability of expedition equipment (tent, etc.) is desirable.**
